The Valdosta-Lowndes County Family YMCA offers a unique opportunity for teens to give back to their YMCA and learn leadership skills by training to be a YMCA Camp Counselor. Included in this packet is an application and CIT Code of Conduct.

<u>Purpose</u>

The purpose of our CIT program is to provide participants with unique training in how to use effective leadership skills throughout their lives and specifically in the camp setting.

Qualifications

Teens ages 13-15 that have the desire and stamina to work with youth in a day camp setting, are interested in gaining leadership skills, can be a team player, resourceful, pleasant, cheerful, friendly, fun, cooperative, flexible, thoughtful and love being around kids are encouraged to apply. Prior YMCA camping experience is not required. Being a CIT requires energy, maturity, and the ability to be an exceptional role model.

Selection Process

Complete and submit the attached application and Code of Conduct to the YMCA. Applications are due by May 25th, 2022. Space is very limited, and selection is not guaranteed. Interviews will be scheduled on a first come, first served basis. Incomplete or illegible applications will not be considered.

Role of a CIT

The program is designed to allow participants to learn about leadership and about themselves. Most of the time CIT's will enjoy applying their leadership skills with an assigned group in the YMCA Summer Day Camp, with the help of the staff of their assigned group. There will be a time each week when all the CIT's will have their own group activities.

Evaluation Process

At the end of the camp, participants will receive verbal and written feedback. At that time participants will also have to opportunity to add their own comments to the evaluation.

Character Development is a critical part of the Valdosta YMCA's Summer Program. Your participation in the Counselor In Training Program will carry the responsibility of exhibiting behavior that reflects the positive core values of honesty, respect, responsibility and caring. The following guidelines are not exhaustive:		
I agree to:		
 Exhibit good character and responsibility at all times to participate fully in all camp programs. Treat all people and property with respect and courtesy by avoiding put-downs, insults, name calling, swearing, sarcasm and other language or nonverbal conduct likely to offend, hurt or set a bad example. 		
 Avoid public displays of affection or sexual conduct of any kind. Use good manners, dress appropriately and not wear clothing that may be offensive or disrespectful to others (clothing advertising tobacco, alcohol or drugs are not permitted). 		
 Practice fair-mindedness by being open to ideas, suggestions and opinions of others. Obey laws and rules as an obligation of being a good role model and not practice double standards. 		
 Accept responsibility for the proper treatment and care for other youth and adults, animals, the environment, the program facilities and equipment. Not possess or use: drugs alcohol, tobacco, firearms, fireworks, knives, and other items deemed dangerous during camp.
